MAGIC WITH FOUND OBJECTS The Set & Costume of Pippin

On his musical journey, Pippin is similar to young people growing up in our technology-dominated world who more-and-more see their self-identity via media and inanimate objects. Director James Vasquez's central vision for this Pippin's world is our modern fascination with reality television, social media, constant documentation of our lives shown in a public feed and total lack of privacy.

To create the world of Diversionary's Pippin, Scenic Designer Sean Fanning and Costume Designer, Shirley Pierson were both inspired by the lack of privacy we experience in today's world. They have created a world "littered" with individual's private belongings - both on our set and on our costumes.

CAMERAS, NOT JUST CLOTHES, MAKE THE MAN

Even if she was not a costume designer, Shirley believes, as Polonius (in *Hamlet*) claims, "the apparel oft proclaims the man." How we dress and the garments we chose to wear each day has always transmitted a message about us to the world. Whether the message projected is a truth has been debated throughout history. Today there is an added twist to the message your garments project. Because of the proliferation of video and surveillance technology in our lives, the image of the message does not simply go away once you change your clothes.

A study ten years ago found that in Manhattan a person was recorded on camera an average of 75 times a day! Today, with the growth of surveillance cameras and digital video cameras in every electronic communication device, that number has most certainly grown. Our lives are not only on display through a camera's lens for security and/or improved communication; that camera now visually creates our personal histories – but with no intent of offering the opportunity to edit; a strange duality indeed.

When searching for a way to represent this reality in the costume design for *Pippin*, Shirley found herself consistently drawn to images of in popular cultural trends, such as punk, rock 'n roll, fashion runways, DIY crafters, but also bloggers and podcasters. In these references, she saw the duality in our cultures lack of privacy.

The key elements of deconstructed clothing include sewing things wrong side out, exposing zippers and seams, recycling of garments, and using garments and pieces of garments in non-traditional ways. So a deconstructed garment looks like it is exposing something, yet at the same time appears to be desperately trying to hold everything together. In the deconstruction it actually has reconstructed into something new - much like the capturing and documentation of our lives through technology exposes us while at the same time creates us.


Generally when collaborating on a production with a design team, the director and designers work to create an environment and costumes that are distinct and stand apart from each other, while still supporting the production's collective theme. For example, "no blue suits sitting on blue upholstered sofas." But for this production, the opposite was true. "Our goal was to create an environment and costumes that appeared to be part of each other," said Shirley. The deconstructed costumes consist of reconstructed pieces of camouflage fabrics and garments, denim, and a variety of personal items slashed, bleached, and stitched together to create a unity with the junk collaged set.

The armor for "War is a science" needed to reflect the "littered" environment as well as support the theatrical fairytale nature of the piece. Shirley went to James with the idea of constructing the "soldier's" breastplates out of cardboard. He planned on staging the number as a drinking game and suggested using beer and wine boxes for it! "Immediately I jumped on the idea, " Shirley laughs, "and found myself cruising the allies behind liquor stores late at night to find empty beer, vodka and tequila boxes. You can probably find me on several liquor store surveillance tapes during the last weeks of August."

When scenic designer, Sean Fanning first talked with James about the show, they were looking for a way to bring the dated aesthetic of the original production to the 21st century. James wanted to re-examine the character of Pippin (rooted in the pop culture and sensibilities of 1972) and his place in today's society. His goal with the environment of the production was to find a way to make a fresh statement about the world we live in today.
