WILLIAM MISSOURI DOWNS (Playwright) After graduating from UCLA Film School, Bill wrote for several NBC television shows and

sold/optioned movies to Imagine and Filmways, but his first love has always been playwriting. He has had well over 100 productions of his plays including Forgiving John Lennon at the Detroit Rep, Innocent Thoughts at the Unicorn Theatre in Kansas City, Kabuki Medea at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, and Backstage at the stadtTheater walfischgasse in Vienna. His dark comedy Dead White Males was a semi-finalist at the Eugene O'Neill and is published by Playscripts. His comedy Jewish Sports Heroes & Texas Intellectuals won the Norfolk Southern Festival of New Works. Samuel French published his award-winning comedies Kosher Lutherans and Cockeyed.

The Exit Interview was a finalist for the Reva Shiner Comedy Award. In addition, Bill has written four books including "The Art of Theatre" (Wadsworth), "Naked Playwriting" and Screenplay: "Writing the Picture" (Silman James). Bill lives in Wyoming.

GIULIO CESARE PERRONE (Scenic Design) Giulio began his career in his native Italy where he directed and designed mainly for the theatre. He recently co-founded the Inferno Theatre Company whose first show. Galileo's Daughters, premiered in September 2010. Mr. Woodhouse cofounded San Diego Repertory Theatre

with D.W. Jacobs in 1976, and has since served as its Producing and Artistic director. He has worked as a director, producer or actor on more than 250 REP productions. Mr. Woodhouse has performed as an actor on the REP stages in The Seafarer, in the title role of King Lear, Proof, Hamlet, and with the San Diego Symphony Orchestra in the title role of Stravinsky's L'Histoire du Soldat. His most recent directorial work with the REP includes: Tortilla Curtain, The Who's TOMMY, In the Next Room or the vibrator play, Superior Donuts, Hairspray, Boom, The Threepenny Opera, and Water & Power. In 2011 he directed American Night: The Ballad of Juan José for the Denver Center Theatre Company. In 2003, he was awarded the Patté Shiley Award for Lifetime Achievement by KPBS and the prestigious Alonzo Award by the Downtown San Diego Partnership. Mr. Woodhouse is the founder of the REP's Calafia Initiative, a multi-disciplinary artistic initiative that brings together unlikely partners to create new works that speak to the future of our bi-national region. In 2006, he and Jacobs were honored with the Craig Noel Award by the San Diego Theatre Critics Circle for 30 years of artistic dedication to downtown and diversity.



TODD SALOVEY (Associate Artistic Director) is in his 20<sup>th</sup> season as the REP's Associate Artistic Director.
