THE CREATIVE TEAM BIOS

HORTON FOOTE (Playwright): Mr. Foote had his first play, Texas Town, produced Off-Broadway in 1941. Since then he has had plays produced on Broadway, Off-Broadway, Off-Off-Broadway and at many regional theatres. Plays include Dividing The Estate, The Last of the Thorntons, Young Man From Atlanta, The Chase, The Traveling Lady, The Trip to Bountiful, Night Seasons, Tomorrow, The Habitation of Dragons, The Orphan's Home Cycle, Roots in a Parched Ground, Convicts, Lily Dale, The Widow Claire, Courtship, Laura Dennis, Vernon Early, The Roads to Home, The Carpetbagger's Children and The Day Emily Married. He received Academy Awards for his screenplay adaptation of To Kill A Mockingbird and his original screenplay, Tender Mercies. He received the Pulitzer Prize for his play, The Young Man From Atlanta, the Lucille Lortel Award for Outstanding Achievement Off-Broadway and the Outer Critics Circle Special Achievement Award for the Signature Series of his plays. In 1996 he was elected to the Theatre Hall of Fame. In 1998 he was elected to membership in the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and at the same time received from the Academy the Gold Medal of Drama for the entire body of his work. In 2000 he received the PEN/Laura Pels Foundation Award for Drama, New York State Governor's Arts Award and in December of that year he was given the National Medal of Arts Award by President Clinton. In 2006 his play, The Trip to Bountiful, won the Lucille Lortel Award for Outstanding Revival and he was given the Drama Desk Lifetime Achievement Award for his body of work. His memoirs, Farewell and Beginnings, are published by Scribners.

KRISTIANNE KURNER (Director): NVA Ensemble Member. Kristianne is the co-founder and Executive Artistic Director of New Village Arts, where she has directed such productions as Same Time, Next Year, Much Ado About Nothing, Summer and Smoke, The Santaland Diaries, Be Aggressive, Bulrusher, True West, Sailor's Song, The Waverly Gallery and A Lie of the Mind. She has been seen on the NVA stages many times, most recently as Adriana in Comedy of Errors, Essie Miller in Ah, Wilderness!, Amanda Blue in Waving Goodbye and the title role in The Heidi Chronicles. Her work has received numerous awards, including San Diego Theatre Critics Circle and Patte Awards for Theatre Excellence. Education: BFA Theatre, The College of William & Mary; MFA Acting, the Actors Studio/New School.

BILL BRADBURY (Original Music and Sound Design): NVA: Original Music, *Of Mice and Men*. Bill Bradbury received his doctorate in music from Cornell University where he was music director for Theatre Cornell. He is a Professor of Music at California State, San Marcos. His work includes compositions for orchestra, chamber ensembles, soloists, and electronic media. His music for *Anza Borrego: Seasons in the Desert* received an Emmy Award for composing and arranging. Bradbury has received grants or commissions from Meet the Composer, the New York State Council on the Arts, the Maryland Arts Council, among others. JANELL CANNON (Scenic Design): is the Carlsbad based author and illustrator of STELLALUNA and five other books for children. She has painted sets for many NVA productions, including *Hamlet, Bulrusher* and *Fool for Love*.

PAT HANSEN (Props Design): Pat Hansen served on NVA's first Board of Directors, and gathered props for several NVA productions. She has a theatre degree from SDSU (class of 1954) and was the founding Artistic Director of Carlsbad Playreaders.
