RICHARD MONTOYA

(El Poeta) As a solo Playwright Montoya penned American Night for the Oregon Shakespeare Festi-

val, Mark Taper Forum and La Jolla Playhouse, Water & Power (Mark Taper Forum, L.A. Drama Critics Award; published by Samuel French); Palestine, New Mexico (Mark Taper Forum); and Anthems (Arena Stage). REP shows include Bordertown, Culture Clash in AmeriCCa and others. New solo works include The River for Campo Santo in San Francisco, and a project for The Ground Floor at Berkeley Rep with Lynn Nottage and Amy Freed, and 32 Beds with Culture Clash for South Coast Repertory in Costa Mesa. A co-writer and co-founder of the legendary Culture Clash performance trio which was founded in 1984. Montoya is a Sundance Institute Writer and Director Film Lab alumnus and was a staff writer for John Wells's acclaimed TV show Southland. His feature film debut which he wrote and directed is Water & Power based on his play. He studied at The American Conservatory Theater. He is the proud father of Mountain Montova - Godfathered by VIDA LOCA - FJP is dedicated to both.



GILBERT
CASTELLANOS (La
Trompeta/Band Leader) Southern California trumpet virtuoso,
Gilbert Castellanos,

makes music that sounds effortless. Recognized as a new American master by Downbeat magazine, Castellanos has established himself as one of the nation's most inventive improvisers in stirring live performances as a member of the Clayton Hamilton Jazz Orchestra, Anthony Wilson Nonet, Charles McPherson Quintet, Tom Scott Quintet, and as leader of his own groups. A passionate advocate of formal jazz education, Castellanos regularly conducts high school workshops and is a lecturer at the University of Southern California's Thornton School of Music and

the Colburn School Of Music. Castellanos attended Berklee College of Music in Boston, and Cal Arts in Los Angeles and quickly rose to national attention as a member of the celebrated band Black/Note, with whom he recorded three albums. His newest album as leader of Gilbert Castellanos and the New Latin Jazz Quintet is slated for release in Fall 2013.



LORRAINE CASTELLANOS

(San Diego) Lorraine Castellanos has an intense passion for music, evident in her

perceptive phrasing and tone, both as a guitarist and a vocalist. Inspired by the likes of Andrés Segovia and Berta Rojas, Castellanos has equal admiration for the great female jazz song stylists such as Sarah Vaughan and Dinah Washington. Castellanos has recently completed her studies at SDSU for a Master's Degree in Classical Guitar Performance under the tutelage of Fred Benedetti. A very promising future is in store for Lorraine Castellanos, who is gaining a reputation as a dynamic musical presence in her hometown of San Diego.



IRVING FLORES

(Piano) Irving Flores is an accomplished pianist, composer, arranger and music producer. He has 35 years of ex-

perience as a professional musician. Flores has been the pianist, arranger and musical director by some of the greatest performers in Latin America: Armando Manzanero, Willie Colon, Tania Libertad, Eugenia Leon and Paulina Rubio, performing and touring Europe, the USA, Central and South America. founded San Diego REPertory Theatre with D.W. Jacobs in 1976, and has since served as its Producing and Artistic Director. He has worked as a director, producer, or actor on more than 250 REP productions. Mr. Woodhouse has performed as an actor on the REP stages in The Seafarer, in the title role of King Lear, Proof, Hamlet, and with the San Diego Symphony Orchestra in the title role of Stravinsky's L'Histoire du Soldat. His most recent directorial work with the REP includes: Clybourne Park, Tortilla Curtain, The Who's TOMMY, In the Next Room or the vibrator play, Superior Donuts, Hairspray, Boom, The Three penny Opera, and Water & Power. In 2011 he directed American Night: The Ballad of Juan José for the Denver Center Theatre Company. In 2003, he was awarded the Patté Shiley Award for Lifetime Achievement by KPBS and the prestigious Alonzo Award by the Downtown San Diego Partnership. Mr. Woodhouse is the founder of the REP's Calafia Initiative, a multi-disciplinary artistic initiative that brings together unlikely partners to create new works that speak to the future of our bi-national region. In 2006, he and Jacobs were honored with the Craig Noel Award by the San Diego Theatre Critics Circle for 30 years of artistic dedication to downtown and diversity.
