

I fell in love with magical realism as a child growing up in Peru. I would hear stories that would swim in my imagination, stories that spun around social themes with luscious language and vivid imagery, tantalizing my young senses so that I felt like I could feel and taste the stories I was hearing. When I moved to the United States I found comfort in the novels of Spanish writers like Mario Vargas Llosa, Gabriel García Márquez and the poems of Pablo Neruda. Then, as a fellow at McCarter Theatre, I was asked to read *House of Bernarda Alba* in the original Spanish to see if the translation we were working with felt genuine to Lorca's rich language. As I read those pages, I savored each word – how poetic and how rich it

was with imagery. It was the difference between saying, "he walks at night" and, "he walks by the light of the moon." Bernarda Alba was my first foray into translation and sealed my love for Spanish writers and most importantly for this language oozing with symbolism, filled with life.

I first encountered José Rivera's work when I read his play *Marisol* as a college student. I was so struck by his powerful themes and incredibly rich language that I might as well have started the Rivera fan club right then and there. I read everything I could get my hands on. *References to Salvador Dali Make Me Hot* is a perfect example of Rivera's best attributes as a writer – love, lust, strong and powerful themes – all told through the voices of magically vivid characters using beautifully spun language. As the story plays out, we become a part of the journey of the heart; we are given a glimpse into the human soul.

In the last five years I've been fortunate enough to move to San Diego, get married and have two beautiful daughters. As my heart has felt love

tug at every ventricle, I often find myself looking for the sentences that describe the deep emotions we experience as human beings. This play has given me many ways to truly describe the rich tapestry that is love and I am grateful to be able to share this amazing play with you all tonight.

May you breathe in the story, feel the love, ache in lust, and dream big passion filled dreams tonight.



Puerto Rico-born José Rivera's plays have been seen nationally, internationally and translated into seven languages. They have

been performed at La Jolla Playhouse, South Coast Rep, Joseph Papp Public Theatre, Playwrights Horizons, the Goodman Theater, the McCarter Theatre, Berkeley Repertory Theatre, American Conservatory Theater, Magic Theatre, the Mark Taper Forum, Actors Theatre of Louisville's Humana Festival, Hartford Stage Company and Yale Repertory Theatre as well as theaters in Mexico, Puerto Rico, Peru, Scotland, Greece, Rumania, Sweden, Norway, England and France. They include the Obie Award winning plays Marisol and References to Salvador Dali Make Me Hot, as well as Cloud Tectonics, Each Day Dies with Sleep, The Promise, The House of Ramon Iglesia, Giants Have Us in Their Books, The Street of the Sun, Sonnets for an Old Century, Boleros for the Disenchanted, Brainpeople and Sueño, among others.

Mr. Rivera was nominated for an Academy Award, a BAFTA Award and a Writers Guild of America Award for his screenplay "The Motorcycle Diaries". The screenplay received Spain's Goya Award. His film "Trade" was the first film to premiere at the United Nations.

His work has been generously support by the Kennedy Center Fund for New American Plays, the National Arts Club, the NEA, the Rockefeller Foundation, the New York Foundation for the Arts, the Fulbright Commission, PEN West and the Whiting foundation. "The House of Roman Iglesia" appeared on the public television series American Playhouse. Rivera has studied with Nobel Prize winner Gabriel García Márquez at the Sundance Institute and was writer-in-residence at the Royal Court Theatre, London.
