You may exit on either side of the theatre, however, I promise you a more entertaining and possibly more cathartic experience if you stay for this particular performance.

Now, if you're here to see the deliciously humorous satire of the American voting process, then you're right where you should be. Sit back, massage your facial muscles (they're gonna get a workout) and get ready to experience the behind the scenes mayhem of a special gubernatorial election process.

I've had the pleasure of working on a couple of Paul Slade Smith's plays, including this one, and they never disappoint in the amount of laughter they produce during rehearsals and performances. With sharp dialogue, levity, characters attempting to solve a problem under hopelessly extreme pressures within a finite amount of time, some sight gags and double takes, Smith whips up the essential ingredients for a great comedy. But while The Outsider has many farcical elements, it is more of a situational comedy. Smith includes moments of honest connection and grounded dialogue, allowing us to breathe and recognize ourselves within some of the characters and situations...even while the walls may come tumbling down.

We have a wonderfully talented group of artists on and off the stage who have worked like mad fools to bring you a slice of joy and respite from the outside world. I thank each and every one of them for their creativity, focus, energy and collaboration with my debut at Scripps Ranch Theatre. I look forward to many more opportunities to share and play in the future.

Neat (Co-production with Loud Fridge Theatre) by Charlayne Woodard March 24 - April 16

On a bare stage, this magnificent storyteller spins her own exquisite real-life remembrance of her brain-damaged aunt, Neat, and the profound change she brought to Charlayne's life. Neat, with her enormous love, energy, simplicity and magnificent clarity, teaches the young Charlayne what it means to cherish life. A magical, compelling, personal portrait of a young woman's coming of age, *Neat* is the story of an urban African-American girl bursting into adulthood, experiencing first love, and embracing both black-pride and feminism. An evening of pure joy, compelling insight, and hopefulness, *Neat* is an inspiration for every family. (*Includes some adult language and themes*)

Lost in Yonkers by Neil Simon May 19 – June 11

By America's great comic playwright, this memory play is set in Yonkers in 1942. Bella is 35 years old, mentally challenged, and living at home with her mother, stern Grandma Kurnitz. As the play opens, ne'er-do-well son Eddie deposits his two young sons on the old lady's doorstep. He is financially strapped and taking to the road as a salesman. The boys are left to contend with Grandma, with Bella and her secret romance, and with Louie, her brother, a small-time hoodlum in a strange new world called Yonkers. This Pulitzer Prize-winning play deceptively hides real honest life affirmation between jokes, and shows why Neil Simon has been called "the Shakespeare of his time," and possibly the "most successful playwright in history."
