

Director's Notes

Hmm.. a director's note. I need to give context to the play, its themes and end with how I want the audience to feel after watching the show. Okay, here it goes...

Director's note: Take 1: Howdy folks! Welcome to Kingsville, Texas. Forty minutes southwest of Corpus Christi and two hours north of the US/Mexico border. Home to Texas A&M Kingsville, Naval Air Station Kingsville and Kings Ranch. Not the right vibe. *Let me start over*.

Take 2: Welcome to Kingsville, Texas. Home of Kings Ranch, the largest ranch in the US. It sparked the Tex-Mex dish Kings Chicken Casserole, a Ford F-150 Truck and contributed to the stolen land and lives of thousands of Tejano people. *Well, that's not wrong*.

Take 3: This is the story of the Vega family. It's just as much your story as it is theirs. Our combined annals are dark and deep with - *Yuck, that sounds gross*.

Take 4: This is the home of the Vega family. If you happen to be an ABC producer, we want you to know that Tejanos offer more than just queso dip, cattle ranching and Selena Quintanilla. *Nope, one more time.*

Take 5: Meet la familia Vega! A Texan Mexican-American family whose blood, sweat and tears run deep in the soil of the Texas borderland. Today, they're on the border of new, uncharted territory. A place that has nothing to do with race or skin color. Their story is universal, encompassing all of our greatest fears wrapped into hope for a way out of the unimaginable.

Don't get me wrong, this show will make you laugh your "Bidi Bidi Bom Bom" off! Through a humorous lens, this play reveals an inside look at what those with privilege ask of those in need before offering life-affirming resources. It's been an honor exploring those questions with this talented cast.


