

One day I get the call I had been waiting for for about 15 years. I am still in disbelief that this show is being produced locally, but that I get to be part of it?! To have the honor of being part of this iconic masterpiece is truly a once in a lifetime experience and I want to start by thanking Jeremy, Jordan, the City of Escondido and California Center of the Arts for making this and stunning works like it part of their programming.

This is a show that comes with a lot of expectation and therefore a lot of pressure. I know shows like this pull in an initial

audience of fans of the work, so my goal is to give the fans what they hope for and expect while breathing fresh life into the piece at the same time and hoping they see something new that they haven't seen before all at the same time. What I love about art is how subjective it is. We all take something uniquely different from it. This show is no exception. It is dense, complex, unbelievably intelligent on a level that is like no other; it won the Pulitzer Prize for a reason. It is important to note that this is a fiction based on a real artist with some facts sprinkled in. There was little known about Georges Seurat at the time of his death at the age of 31.

Normally in a director's note I would want to tell you a bit about the concept, etc., but with this show I don't want to cloud your thoughts with my own. You should be starting with a clean slate;
