# **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

Three years ago, our plan was to open this play in March 2020. We were well into rehearsals, the set had been built, and we were about to head into tech weekend. Then I get a call. "The theatre is shut down for the week." Then I get another call a week later. "The theatre is shut down indefinitely." The Roommate was canceled and life, as we knew it, would never be the same.

A month into the pandemic, ironically, I was suddenly on the search for roommates. Due to financial hardship, I had to find a new place to live. So, I made a call. "Mom. Dad. Can I come home?" Not in my original life plan at 36, but they welcomed me in without hesitation. Oh, if you were a fly on a wall at the Ginn household. Cut to my father, a very chatty morning person wanting to interact and talk about my car insurance at 7am. Cut to myself, a very grumpy morning person who does not like to interact with anyone until after the second cup of coffee is complete. We made it through two and a half years of living together under one roof, and in hindsight, I am so grateful for that time with my parents. Roommates come into your life for a moment in time... and truly change you.

Jen Silverman's play captures so much of the hilarity and vulnerability that comes with living with a roommate. Especially a roommate who is your complete opposite. These characters are also in moments of their lives when they are dealing with immense amounts of change...or trying to change and failing at it. Change and growth is uncomfortable. Silverman has written a play that allows us to delight in watching these characters deal with life when they're trying to burn it all down and start over. Thank you to Kim and Milena for finding the humor and the heart of this play every night. The laughter has been healing.

So here we are. Three years later. We have changed in so many ways. For one thing, we value understudies more (thank you Wendy Maples!). Sometimes our plans do not go as we wish. But I'm glad Kristianne Kurner decided to give me another call. "Ready to direct *The Rooommate* again?" Yes. Yes, I am. Here we go, take two.
