DIRECTOR'S NOTE



An abandoned theatre, long forgotten and in disrepair, is the setting in which we tell the story of Pippin, a young man on his search for purpose and significance.

It is said that every theatre has a ghost.

Most theatres also have a ghost light, which is a single bulb left burning whenever a theatre is dark and every "living" person has left for the night. Superstition has it that its function is to light the way for the ghosts that are said to inhabit virtually every theatre, keeping them happy and contented and even giving them the opportunity to "perform" or dance on the stage. Many people have stories to share about sightings of these spirits, including myself and most of my fellow theatre-folk. These "Players" have passed on, yet for some reason they choose to hold onto a moment where on stage they felt their purpose, their joy; where they felt most alive, home.

This is a story of a young man who is broken and lost, perhaps running away from something. He is searching for something, anything, to make sense of his life and to find a place where he can belong.

Originally produced on Broadway in 1972, and directed and choreographed by the brilliant Bob Fosse, Pippin may resonate more today than it did then. Young adults today find themselves without a road map. Drifters longing for meaning and connection in a disconnected world; they are searching outside of themselves for the answer.

Pippin's enduring popularity is due to its timeless theme of self-discovery and the desire to find our place in the world in order to create a meaningful life.

PROFILES



STEPHEN SCHWARTZ (Music & Lyrics) wrote the music and lyrics for the current Broadway hit *Wicked*, and has also contributed music and/or lyrics to *Godspell*, *Pippin*, *The Magic Show*, *The Baker's Wife*, *Working* (which he also adapted and directed), *Rags*, and *Children of Eden*. He collaborated with Leonard Bernstein on the English texts for Bernstein's *Mass* and wrote the title song for the play and movie *Butterflies Are Free*. For children, he has written songs for two musicals, *Captain Louie* and *My Son Pinocchio*. He has also worked in film, collaborating with Alan Menken on the songs for Disney's "Enchanted," as well as the animated features "Pocahontas," and "The Hunchback of Notre Dame," and writing the songs for the DreamWorks animated feature "The Prince of Egypt." His first opera, "Séance on a Wet Afternoon," was produced at Opera Santa Barbara and New York City Opera. A book about his career, "Defying Gravity," has been released by Applause Books. Mr. Schwartz has been inducted into the Theatre Hall of Fame and the Songwriters Hall of Fame, and has been given a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. Awards include three Academy Awards, four Grammy Awards, and a tiny handful of tennis trophies.

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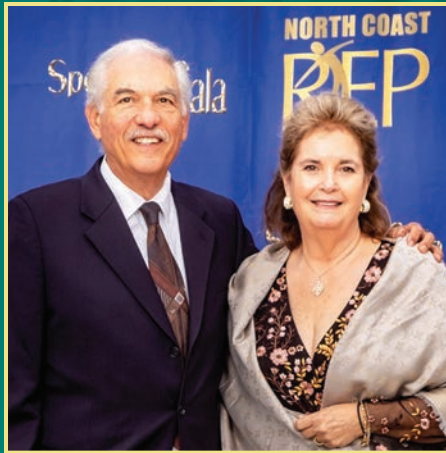
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JUDGE H. LEE SAROKIN

Judge H. Lee Sarokin was beloved by the North Coast Rep community, where several of his plays enjoyed staged readings, including *The Race Card Face Up*. He was a humanitarian, advocate, scholar, and beloved husband to Margie.

He leaves behind an enduring legacy. During his tenure as part of the U.S. District Court, and later the U.S. Court of Appeals, he wrote over 2500 opinions, including being the first judge to order tobacco companies to reveal their research, ordering clubs such as Kiwanis to admit women, and freeing Rubin "Hurricane" Carter after 19 years in prison for a wrongful conviction. He received numerous awards and honors for his judicial career.

He tutored children at Casa de Amistad — where he also started a music program, taught at the Braille Institute, and played drums with local jazz groups.

By any measure, Lee made the lives of those around him better. Everyone at North Coast Rep will miss Judge Sarokin greatly.

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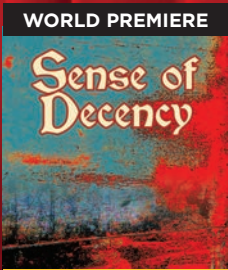
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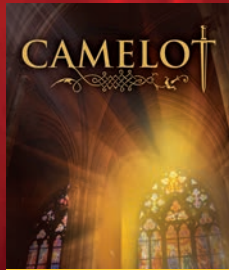
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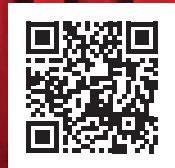
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
